Discussion Questions

1. The Kingdom Starts Smaller Than You Think

What are some examples in Scripture or in your own life where God used something small to accomplish something great?

How does Ezekiel 17 deepen your understanding of the mustard seed parable? What does it tell us about God's long-term plan for the nations?

2. The Kingdom Grows in Ways You Cannot See

What are some ways you've seen quiet, unseen growth in your spiritual life—or in someone else's?

How does this parable shape your expectations for what Christian influence in the world should look like?

3. The Kingdom Is Meant to Permeate the World

How does the exile ethic in Jeremiah 29:4-14 challenge or encourage your current posture toward culture?

What's one specific way you can "live as leaven" and "seek the peace and prosperity" of your community this week?

4. The Kingdom Fulfills the Ancient Story

How does it change your view of the kingdom to realize it's been part of God's plan "from the foundation of the world"?

What would it mean to trust God with small faithfulness this week?

How can we encourage one another to live like mustard seed people and leaven-like witnesses?

Family Discussion

A mustard seed may be tiny, but inside is a whole tree just waiting to grow. It wasn't made to stay in a vial, it was meant to be planted.

Why did Jesus use a mustard seed to talk about God's kingdom? Can something that small really do something big?

What would happen if we left the seed in this vial forever? Would it grow? Would anything change? What does that tell us about our faith?

Activity: As a family, choose one action this week where you "plant" a small mustard seed of kindness, truth, or faith.

This week, don't just look at your mustard seed, live it.

Pray for Missions – Germany

Percent Evangelical – 2.1% **Area** – 138,067 square miles

Millions of immigrants, guest workers, students, and refugees have come to Germany since 1989. Some are vibrant Christians, but most do not know the gospel. Germany openly received a large numbers of migrants during the migrant crisis of 2015 and thereafter. German society and government have struggled to react well to this massive inflow of people, and some have reacted with violence or bitterness towards immigrants, especially in the east. Yet it is an amazing mission opportunity.
