Discussion Questions

1. What is God's ultimate purpose in creation, redemption, and the church?

Read Ephesians 1:6, 12, and 14. How do these verses shape the way we understand the church's identity?

2. Why is God's passion for His own glory not selfish or egotistical?

Discuss the idea that God glorifying Himself is the most loving thing He could do for us. What happens when we glorify anything less than God?

3. According to Ephesians 2:21–22, what is the church being built into?

How does this image of a temple help us understand our role and identity as believers, both individually and corporately?

4. How does the truth that God's presence now dwells in His people (not in a physical temple) change the way we think about church gatherings, mission, and daily life?

See also 1 Corinthians 3:16–17 and 2 Corinthians 6:16–18.

5. What are some ways we, as a “holy temple” and “kingdom of priests,” can reflect God’s glory in the world?

Think practically: What does this look like in worship, service, hospitality, evangelism, or even conflict?

6. Where are you tempted to make church about yourself — your preferences, your comfort, or your recognition?

How can refocusing on God’s glory free us from consumerism and lead us into deeper joy?

Family Discussion

1. How are Christians like mirrors when it comes to showing who God is?
2. Why do you think it's important that we reflect God's love, kindness, and truth to others? What happens when we don't?
3. Can a mirror shine light on its own? What does that teach us about our connection to Jesus?
4. How can our family be a mirror this week? What are some small or big ways we can reflect God's glory to neighbors, friends, or even each other?

Pray for Missions – Cuba

Largest Religion – Christianity, 56.5% **Population** – 10.9 million

Percent Evangelical – 8.8% **Area** – 42,800 square miles

Cuba faces a difficult future. Communist Party leaders hold power, but this economic approach cannot last forever. The economy is one of the weakest in the Caribbean, and too few young people remain to support the older generation. Deep poverty led to a successful black market with widespread crime, drugs, and prostitution. The regime imprisoned more than 500,000 for political reasons, and over a million became refugees in the USA. Pray that the Cuban diaspora might find Christ and influence their original homeland. Pray for reasonable reforms, freedom, forgiveness, and for every industry built on sin to be overcome by good.
