Discussion Questions

The parable of the net reminds us that the kingdom gathers “fish of every kind.” Are there ways we try to do God’s job in sorting people instead of just inviting them?

Jesus ends His teaching on the parables by asking, “Have you understood all these things?” How would you answer that question? Are there parts of Jesus’ teaching you still wrestle with?

Jesus calls His disciples “scribes trained for the kingdom.” What do you think it mean to be trained by Jesus today? How are you being disciplined—intentionally shaped—by Him and His Word?

Jesus compared the scribe to a master of a house. In what way are those two roles similar? How does it relate to bringing out treasures both old and new.

What are some “old treasures” you’ve held onto in your faith? What “new treasures” has God been revealing to you recently?

What is the difference between knowing Scripture and treasuring it? What’s one verse or promise that has become treasure to you? What’s a way you can move from simply knowing Scripture to truly storing it up in your heart?

Read Matthew 13:53–58. Jesus returns to His hometown and is rejected. Why do you think this story is placed right after all the parables? What does this rejection teach us about how people respond to the kingdom and how we should respond when others don’t “understand all these things”?

Family Discussion

Jesus said that the kingdom of God is like a net that gathers all kinds of fish? Why do you think only God gets to decide which fish stay in the net at the end?

Jesus said, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." What are some ways we can help "cast the net" and invite others to know Jesus?

What's something you've put in your treasure box that helps you remember something Jesus taught? Why is it important to keep Jesus' words, not just hear them?

How can our family help each other be like "scribes of the kingdom" who remember, treasure, and share the things Jesus taught?

Pray for Missions – Haiti

Largest Religion – Christianity, 95.1% **Population** – 11.9 million

Percent Evangelical – 16% **Area** – 10,714 square miles

Tyranny, cruelty, and spiritual bondage fill Haiti's history. Violent colonization, Spanish and then French slavery, and Haiti's own brutal leaders promoted a spirit of violence for centuries. Voodoo (a religion of spirits) creates fear throughout society. Many Catholics practice some voodoo. Pray that the power of the Holy Spirit might overcome the forces of evil. Pray for the Holy Spirit to cleanse the Church. Evangelical Christians have steadily grown in number over the decades, through evangelism, love in action and by openly standing against voodooism and the spiritual forces behind it.
