## **Discussion Questions**

### **The Kingdom is Worth Everything**

Re-read Matthew 13:44–46. What similarities and differences do you notice between the two parables? What do these parables teach us about the value of the kingdom of heaven?

### **We Are Not The Heroes of the Story**

Did you hear something in this sermon that surprised you, challenged you, or gave you hope? How had you understood these parables? What seemed to be the main point?

Read Luke 19:10 and Romans 5:8. How do these verses support the idea that Jesus is the one who seeks and saves us?

What does it mean to you that the Father gave up His “everything” by sending His Son (John 3:16, Romans 8:32)? How does that deepen your view of God’s love?

### **Treasure Overflows: Received Not Earned**

What “lesser treasures” in your life might you be clinging to? How does seeing Christ as the true treasure help you let go of those things?

How can you remind yourself this week that the kingdom is a *gift* and not something you earn?

In what ways can your joy in Christ overflow into generosity, obedience, or witness to others?

## **Family Discussion**

What's the coolest treasure you can imagine finding?

What do you think Jesus meant when He told a story about someone finding a treasure and giving up everything to get it?

The pearl you got today is just a reminder. What does it make you think of? Does it help you remember how much God loves you?

In the big sermon today, we heard a surprise twist: What if YOU were the treasure Jesus gave up everything to buy? How does that make you feel?

Why do you think God gave His Son, Jesus, for us? What's one way you can show God how thankful you are this week?

## **Pray for Missions – Guatemala**

**Largest Religion** – Christianity, 96.1%    **Population** – 18.7 million

**Percent Evangelical** – 24.4%                      **Area** – 42,042 square miles

Guatemala is a tale of two kingdoms. Widespread evangelism occurs by many means - city crusades, 148 Christian schools and institutes, more than 50 local Christian radio stations, numerous Christian magazines and newspapers as well as the personal witness of individual churches and Christians in over 25,000 congregations. Yet, violence is a present-day plague caused by the upheaval and ruin of the last few decades. Murder is common, and life is cheap. Private armed guards outnumber police two to one. Pray for a binding of the spirit of greed and violence and for the peace of the gospel of Christ to prevail.
