## Discussion Questions

### **God Knows the Truth About Our Hearts (Luke 16:14–15)**

Where in life are we most tempted to “paint over” our struggles instead of addressing what’s really going on? Jesus says, “God knows your hearts.” How does that truth bring both conviction and comfort? How can we guard against living for human recognition?

### **God’s Word Points to the Kingdom (Luke 16:16–18)**

How can knowledge of the Bible become a danger if we use it the wrong way? What do you think that urgent, determined pursuit of Christ’s kingdom might look like in our lives today? Are there any areas where you’re tempted to create “loopholes” in obedience to God’s Word?

### **God Sees More Than Our Earthly Status (Luke 16:19–26)**

How does the reversal in the story of the rich man and Lazarus challenge our natural assumptions about blessing and suffering? How might remembering eternity change the way we handle both comfort and hardship now?

### **God’s Word is Sufficient (Luke 16:27–31)**

Abraham tells the rich man’s brothers, “They have Moses and the Prophets; let them hear them.” What does this say about the sufficiency of God’s Word? Why do you think even the greatest miracle — “someone rising from the dead” — wouldn’t convince a hard heart? What are some ways we can respond to God’s Word today with urgency?

## **Family Discussion**

Use these questions this week to help your child remember what they learned.

Why do you think God’s Word is called a “sword”?

What’s one Bible verse you already know that could help you when you’re afraid or tempted?

How did Jesus use Scripture when He was tempted in the wilderness?

Why do we need to practice using the Sword of the Spirit instead of waiting until we’re in trouble?

How is God’s Word different from other books we read?

How can you practice using your Sword of the Spirit this week?
