Discussion Questions

1. The Dependent Receive the Kingdom (Luke 18:15–17)

Why do you think Jesus used children as the example of kingdom readiness? Who do we (even unintentionally) tend to exclude from our “mental picture” of kingdom people? How might our church or group better reflect Jesus' open invitation?

2. The Self-Sufficient Walk Away Empty (Luke 18:18–23)

The rich ruler asks, “What must I do?” Do we ask similar performance-based questions of God? What kinds of “credentials” or “conditions” are you tempted to hold up before God? Why is it good news that Jesus doesn't just ask for external behavior, but goes after the heart?

3. The Impossible Is Possible with God (Luke 18:24–30)

Why do you think Jesus used such an extreme image (camel and needle) instead of something more achievable? How do we avoid turning surrender into another form of performance? What does Peter's clumsy but hopeful response teach us about growing in grace?

Remind each other this week:

You don't have to master grace to receive it. You just have to stay close to the One who gives it?

Family Discussion

Use these questions this week to help your child remember what they learned.

Why couldn't the monkey get his hand out of the trap?

What are some things we sometimes hold onto too tightly?

Why do you think the rich man walked away from Jesus feeling sad?

What does it mean to come to Jesus like a child?

What do we get when we let go and follow Jesus?

Pray for Missions – Morocco

Largest Religion – Muslim, 99.9%

Population – 38.4 million

Percent Evangelical – 0%

Area – 761,610 square miles

Arabic armies invaded in the 7th century, introduced Islam, and erased a strong North African Berber Church. Moroccans feel proud of their country's heritage as a center of Islamic civilization and learning, and they resist Christianity. Only a small percentage have heard the gospel. Moroccan Muslim groups disagree sharply between fundamentalist and moderate practices, but most citizens do not want religious violence to come. There may be about 2,000 Moroccan Christians, with 20 to 30 small house fellowships. New believers feel pressure from family, police, or religious authorities. Pray that believers might grow amid such persecution, as with the early Church, through faith, witness, mutual support, and encouragement!
