Discussion Questions

Read Isaiah 5:1–7 aloud. What does God’s care for the vineyard show us about His character? How does that picture shape our understanding of His kingdom?

In the parable, the Master sends servant after servant, and finally His Son. Read 2 Peter 3:9. How do you see God’s patience reflected in this story? How have you experienced His patience in your own life?

The tenants refused to give fruit to the Master, trying to claim the vineyard for themselves. How is that like Adam and Eve grasping the fruit in Eden (Genesis 3:1–7)? Where do we still fall into the trap of wanting God’s gifts without His rule?

Jesus’ parable suggests the tenants acted as though the Master was harsh, like a devourer, when He was actually generous. In what ways do people today view God as oppressive or demanding? What truths about His character counter that distortion?

Read verses 37–39. What does this moment reveal about the depth of human rebellion? How does Romans 8:32 (“He who did not spare His own Son...”) reshape our view of the Master’s love?

Jesus says, “The kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people producing its fruits” (v. 43). What kind of fruit is He looking for? (Hint: Galatians 5:22–23 and John 15:5) How do these passages describe kingdom fruit?

In Matthew 25:23 the faithful servant is told, “Enter into the joy of your Master.” How does this promise shed light on what the tenants missed? What does it mean to you personally that the Master invites us not just to serve Him, but to share in His joy?

Family Discussion

Use these questions this week to help your child remember what they learned.

God is the Master of the vineyard, what kinds of good things has He planted in your life to help you grow?

Why do you think some people are afraid of God or think He asks for too much? Can you think of a Bible story that shows God is generous and loving?

Jesus says the fruit He wants is things like love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, and goodness (Galatians 5:22–23). Which of those do you want God to grow in your life this week?

The bad tenants in the story never knew the Master’s heart. But Jesus says when we follow Him, we get to share the joy of our Master (Matthew 25:23). What do you think the “joy of the Master” feels like?

Pray for Missions – Pakistan

Largest Religion – Muslim, 95.8% **Population** – 255.2 million

Percent Evangelical – 0.6% **Area** – 340,509 square miles

Huge cultural boundaries exist between the Muslim majority and the Christian minority, primarily because the existing Church emerged from the lowest rungs of society. Little has been done to reach Muslims or even Hindus. Many factors conspire to make Christians fearful, introspective and silent, yet despite the negatives, there is a considerable degree of freedom to openly share the gospel for those with the boldness and faith. Pray for Christians to be impassioned and equipped to share their faith and to answer the claims and questions of Muslims.
