Discussion Questions

Unity (v. 1–2): Paul roots unity in shared encouragement, love, and participation in the Spirit. How is this different from unity based on agreement, personality, or preference? What most often threatens unity in the church today?

Humility (v. 3–4): The sermon described humility as self-forgetfulness, not self-hatred. What are some subtle ways pride can show up in religious or “good” behavior? How does looking at Jesus’ humility reshape our understanding of power and importance?

The Christ Hymn (v. 5–11): What stands out to you most about Jesus’ downward movement: His refusal to grasp, His obedience, or His willingness to suffer? How does this challenge common cultural ideas of success, influence, or leadership?

Obedience (v. 12–13): Paul calls believers to “work out” their salvation because God is already at work in them. How does this passage help us hold together responsibility and dependence without slipping into guilt or passivity?

Attitude (v. 14–15): Why do you think Paul treats grumbling and disputing as serious threats to Christian witness? What do our attitudes during hardship communicate about what we believe God is like?

Paul’s Joy (v. 16–18): Paul rejoices when he sees Christ reflected in the Philippians, even at great personal cost. What does this reveal about what Paul values most? How does this reshape the way we think about success or fruitfulness in ministry and community life?

Join one of our Breaking Bread Groups where we get together as families and individuals to discuss the things that God is teaching us through his word. We usually have some good food too. There is more information about our current groups on the back table.

Family Discussion

- The Bible tells us that Jesus is God but chose to serve others. Why do you think Jesus chose to help instead of showing off His power?
- What does it mean to follow Jesus? Is it just about what we say we believe, or also about how we live?
- What does it look like to get along with others at home, school, or church, even when it's hard?
- Humility means not always putting yourself first. Can you think of a time when someone put you first? How did that feel?
- Paul says we should not grumble or complain all the time. How does complaining change the way people feel? What happens when we choose thankfulness instead?
- The sermon said our lives are like mirrors that show what Jesus is like. What do you hope people see about Jesus when they look at your life?
