

Discussion Questions

1. In Acts 16, the church at Philippi begins through very different conversion stories. What stands out to you about Lydia, the jailer, and the enslaved girl? What do these stories teach us about how God brings people to faith?
2. Paul is imprisoned when he writes this letter. How does his situation strengthen the promise of Philippians 1:6?
3. In what ways are we tempted to think of salvation as something we “decided” or “managed” rather than something God began? How does viewing salvation as God’s work change the way we talk about our past, our present struggles, and our future hope?
4. The sermon distinguished between the work that was *finished* at conversion and the work that is still *being completed* in us. Why do we need both truths?
5. Read Philippians 1:9–11 aloud together. How does Paul’s prayer challenge common ideas of spiritual success? Why does Paul tie love, holiness, and fruitfulness so closely to “the day of Jesus Christ”?
6. The sermon highlighted six words drawn from the text: Glorify – Jesus – Grow – Holy – Love – Generously. Which of these words do you find most encouraging right now? Which feels most challenging?
7. How do these words describe what God produces rather than what we manufacture? What happens to Christian life and community when these goals are separated from God’s glory?
8. How does anchoring our lives in “the day of Jesus Christ” change the way we view this coming year?
