Discussion Questions

Why do you think reminders about pride and false holiness are necessary for growing Christians?

In your own words, what does Paul mean by “confidence in the flesh”? Why is confidence in the flesh often harder to recognize when it shows up in good or religious things rather than obvious sin?

Can you think of examples where responsibility, discipline, or morality might quietly turn into self-trust?

Paul lists his religious résumé in verses 4–6. Why do you think he shares this so openly? What kinds of “résumés” do people today tend to rely on for a sense of worth or security?

How does Paul’s willingness to call his former boasting “loss” challenge the way we think about success or faithfulness?

Paul does not say his achievements were sinful, but that they were dangerous when used for the wrong purpose. Why is that distinction important? Why do you think it is so hard to hold Christ alone without also clinging to something of our own?

What does the phrase “being found in Christ” communicate that words like achieving or proving do not? In what ways does being “found” by Christ challenge both pride and despair?

Join one of our Breaking Bread Groups where we get together as families and individuals to discuss the things that God is teaching us through his word. We usually have some good food too. There is more information about our current groups on the back table.

Family Discussion

- Holiness is not like earning a trophy. What did we say holiness is instead? (Listen for: staying close to Jesus, trusting Him)
- Do you think Jesus loves you more when you do really well? Do you think Jesus loves you less when you mess up?
- When you mess up, what do you usually feel like doing? (hide, blame, get angry, give up) What does it look like to run to Jesus instead?
- Why do you think people sometimes brag about being “good” or “right”? How is staying close to Jesus different from just trying to be a good person?
