Discussion Questions

The sermon said, “Love in the New Testament always moves toward sacrifice.” Where have you seen that clearly in Scripture? What kind of “ordinary suffering” does love require in everyday relationships?

How is “agree in the Lord” different from agreeing about everything? In conflict, what do you most struggle to lay down: pride, control, comfort, or the need to be right?

How does anxiety relate to self-protection? How does praying for “daily bread” challenge our instinct to hoard security? Where are you most tempted to build “storehouses” instead of trusting God daily?

How do Jesus’ words about forgiveness in the model prayer (Matthew 6:12-15) make you feel? What is the difference between struggling to forgive and refusing to forgive?

What kinds of negative thoughts do you tend to mentally hoard: offenses, fear, comparison, self-justification? How does replaying an offense make forgiveness harder over time?

Which word in Philippians 4:8 challenges you most right now? Why is loving with renewed minds impossible apart from Christ? How does remembering that Christ intercedes for you change how you respond to others’ failures?

Join one of our Breaking Bread Groups where we get together as families and individuals to discuss the things that God is teaching us through is word. We usually have some good food too. There is more information about our current groups on the back table.

Family Discussion

- Love means being willing to give something up for someone else. What are some small things we can give up to love each other better?
- Jesus taught us to pray, "Give us this day our daily bread." What does that teach us about trusting God? How does trusting God help us be more generous and kind?
- When someone hurts you, is it easier to forgive quickly or to keep thinking about what happened? How does remembering how much Jesus forgave us soften our hearts?
- What does our family usually argue about? When we argue, what kinds of thoughts usually run through our heads? How does what we think about affect we do? How can we help each other redirect our thoughts?
