Discussion Questions

In Philippians 3:10-11, Paul speaks of knowing Christ, sharing in His sufferings, and attaining resurrection. How do those ideas challenge common assumptions about what it means to follow Jesus?

The sermon distinguished between knowing Christ relationally and knowing facts about Christ. Where do you see the temptation to relate to Jesus more like a “fan” than someone whose life is truly united to His? What makes that kind of distant relationship appealing?

The sermon described righteousness as something God produces inwardly and holiness as the outward expression of that righteousness. Why is it important to keep those two ideas distinct but connected?

Paul says he has not arrived, but he is pressing on. Why do you think Scripture holds humility and effort together instead of choosing one or the other?

What are some subtle ways people can pursue comfort, control, or approval while still using Christian language? How does Paul’s warning about “enemies of the cross” speak into that?

Paul says our citizenship is in heaven. What does that mean practically for how we view success, security, or identity in this world?

Join one of our Breaking Bread Groups where we get together as families and individuals to discuss the things that God is teaching us through is word. We usually have some good food too. There is more information about our current groups on the back table.

Family Discussion

- What are some ways we can know about someone without really knowing them? How is knowing Jesus meant to be different?
- The sermon talked about God making our hearts clean on the inside through Jesus. Why do you think God cares about our hearts and not just our behavior?
- If we really know Jesus, how might our words or actions start to change? Can you think of a time when it was hard to do the loving or kind thing? What might Jesus do in a situation like that?
- What are some things people think are really important in the world that won't last forever? What are some things that will last forever because they come from Jesus?
- The question "What Would Jesus Do?" helps us think before we act. Can you think of one situation this week where that question might help you?
