Discussion Questions

In Jonah 1:11, what do the sailors ask Jonah, and what does their question reveal about how they are beginning to think about the situation? Look closely at Jonah's response in verse 12. What exactly does he tell them to do, and what reasons does he give for it?

Why do you think Jonah tells the sailors to throw him into the sea instead of taking action himself? What might this suggest about his heart or his understanding of the situation?

In verse 13, how do the sailors respond to Jonah's instruction? The sailors delay obeying Jonah and try to row back to land. What does this reveal about their character, especially in contrast to Jonah? Why do you think their efforts fail, even though they are sincere and urgent?

In verse 14, the sailors begin praying to the LORD. What has changed in their understanding of God from earlier in the chapter?

The storm stops immediately after Jonah is thrown overboard. What does this suggest about the purpose of the storm and what was required for it to cease?

The sailors "feared the LORD exceedingly" in verse 16. How is this fear different from the fear they showed earlier in the storm?

Why do you think their fear leads to sacrifice and vows? What does that tell us about the nature of true fear of the Lord?

Breaking Bread Groups are where we get together as families and individuals to discuss the things that God is teaching us through His Word. There is more information about our current groups on the back table.

Family Discussion

1. Jonah told the sailors to throw him into the sea. Why do you think he didn't just jump in himself? What does that show us about his heart?
2. The sailors didn't want to throw Jonah in right away. What did they try first, and what does that tell us about them?
3. When the sailors tried to row harder to save themselves, what happened? How is that like the finger trap when you pull harder?
4. When Jonah was thrown into the sea, the storm stopped immediately. What does that show us about what was really needed to calm the storm?
5. Jonah went into the water because of his own sin, but Jesus went to the cross for ours. How does trusting Jesus differ from trying harder to fix things on our own?
