Discussion Questions

In Jonah 3:10, what does God “see”? How does the text define the Ninevites’ response? What is the difference between Nineveh’s “turning” and God’s “relenting?” Why is that distinction important?

The Hebrew word *ra* is repeated several times in Jonah 3:10–4:2. It usually gets translated as evil or disaster. In Jonah 4:1, this word shows up twice but our English translations miss it. “It was evil to Jonah, a great evil, and he was angry.” What does this reveal about how Jonah views God’s actions?

What reasons does Jonah give in 4:2 for why he fled to Tarshish? What does this tell us about his understanding of God? How does Jonah’s reaction challenge the idea that knowing correct theology automatically leads to a right heart?

The sermon described a downward spiral: forgotten grace → elevated self → distorted vision → restricted mercy → resenting God. Which of these steps feels most familiar or dangerous in your own life right now?

When have you found it hardest to rejoice in God’s mercy toward someone else? What made that situation difficult?

Why do you think Jonah would rather die than live in a world where Nineveh receives mercy? What does that reveal about his priorities and values?
