Discussion Questions

What similarities do you see between Jonah and Elijah?
What differences? What do these reveal about each prophet's expectation of God?

Jonah goes east of the city, builds a booth, and waits to see what will happen. What does this posture reveal about him?

God appoints the qiyayon, the plant, to give Jonah shade and relief. Why is it important to see the plant as a good gift from God? What does Jonah's "exceeding gladness" over the plant reveal about his heart?

What are some examples of our modern qiyayons? Why is it often easier to identify them when they are threatened or removed than when we are enjoying them? What has loss or disruption revealed about your heart in the past?

God appointed the plant, but also the worm and the wind. Why is it difficult to trust God's goodness not only when He gives shade, but also when He removes it?

God asks Jonah, "Do you do well to be angry for the plant?" Why does God move from the general question about anger to the specific question about the plant? What specific attachment might God be naming in your life right now?

Elijah and Jonah both receive questions from God, and both struggle to answer rightly. What does this teach us about God's patience with His servants? How does it encourage you that neither prophet processes his despair perfectly?
