Discussion Questions

Read Jonah 4:10–11. Why does God emphasize that Jonah did not labor for the plant or make it grow? What does this reveal about the difference between receiving a gift from God and treating that gift as something we own?

Jonah cared deeply about the plant, but not about Nineveh. What is a “qiqayon” in our lives that can become larger in our hearts than people? How can good gifts like comfort, routine, safety, reputation, political concerns, preferences, or traditions become disordered loves?

Where do you see Jonah lifting himself up over Nineveh, over God’s mercy, or over God Himself? Where are you most tempted to defend yourself before God instead of humbling yourself under His hand?

How does 1 Peter 5:6 help us understand what God is doing with Jonah? What is the difference between God humbling someone to crush them and God humbling someone so that He might lift them up in due time?

God says Nineveh has more than 120,000 people who “do not know their right hand from their left.” Why is it important to say that their ignorance is not innocence? How does their ignorance reveal both their guilt and their desperate need for God’s Word?

God’s answer to Nineveh’s ignorance was to send a prophet with a message. What does this teach us about evangelism and missions? How should we think about the billions of people today with little or no meaningful access to the gospel?
