Discussion Questions

Read 2 Corinthians 5:14–15. Paul says the love of Christ controls or compels us. What are some other things that can control a Christian or a church if we are not careful?

What does it mean that Christ died so “that those who live might no longer live for themselves”? Where do you most feel the tension between living for Christ and living for yourself?

Read 2 Corinthians 5:16–17. Paul says that if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. Why is it important to say that salvation is personal, but not private?

How does being “in Christ” change the way we see other people, especially people we might naturally judge, avoid, fear, or resent?

Read 2 Corinthians 5:18–19. What does the word “reconciliation” teach us about both our problem and God’s grace? Why is it humbling that God gives the “message of reconciliation” to people who have themselves needed to be reconciled?

Read 2 Corinthians 5:20–21. What does it mean for the church to be “ambassadors for Christ”? What does an ambassador do, and what does an ambassador not have the authority to do?

How does baptism publicly display the truth of 2 Corinthians 5:17, that the old has passed away and the new has come? Why is baptism not merely an individual testimony, but also a reminder to the whole church?

The heart of the church’s message is not merely “come to church,” but “be reconciled to God.” How does that sharpen the way we think about evangelism and mission?

Breaking Bread Groups are where we get together as families and individuals to discuss the things that God is teaching us through His Word. There is more information about our current groups on the back table.
