Discussion Questions

Read Mark 1:16–20. What stands out to you about where Jesus finds Simon, Andrew, James, and John? Why does it matter that Jesus calls them in the middle of ordinary work and ordinary life?

Jesus says, “Follow me.” What does it mean that discipleship is not asking Jesus to bless the road we have already chosen, but coming behind Him as the One who leads?

In what ways can following Jesus be understood as a “declaration of dependence” rather than a declaration of independence? Where do you find it hardest to surrender self-rule to Christ?

Jesus says, “I will make you become fishers of men.” Why is it encouraging that Jesus does not merely command them to become something new, but promises to make them what He calls them to be?

Simon and Andrew immediately leave their nets. What might the nets represent in this passage? What are some “nets” we are tempted to pick back up when following Jesus becomes costly, confusing, or uncomfortable?

James and John leave their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired servants. How does this passage help us think about the cost of following Jesus, especially when good things like work, family, comfort, and security must come under His lordship?

Andrew, Peter, James, and John all followed Jesus, but their roads looked very different. How can comparison become a trap in the Christian life? How does Jesus’ word to Peter in John 21:22 help us fight that temptation?
