Discussion Questions

Read Mark 3:7–12. What draws the crowds to Jesus? Is it wrong to come to Jesus because we need something from Him? Where can that desire become distorted?

The unclean spirits correctly say, “*You are the Son of God.*” What does this show us about the difference between knowing true things about Jesus and actually trusting and following Him?

Read Mark 3:13–15. Verse 13 says Jesus “*called to him those whom he desired.*” How does that challenge the fear that we are a nuisance to God when we keep coming to Him with the same needs, fears, sins, and burdens? What passages elsewhere in Scripture encourage us to keep drawing near?

Why do you think Mark says Jesus appointed them “*that they might be with him*” before mentioning preaching or authority? What does that order teach us about discipleship and ministry?

How does the order be with Him, then be sent by Him connect with the Sabbath theme? Read Mark 16-19. How does Israel’s failure to enter God’s rest because of unbelief help us understand the danger represented by Judas?

How does this passage reshape the way we think about heaven and eternal life? If the great hope is ultimately to “be with the Lord,” how is that different from imagining heaven merely as a perfect version of our current lives with Jesus somewhere nearby?

Are you most tempted to want Jesus mainly for His gifts, to know about Him without surrendering to Him, to harden your heart while staying near Christian things, or to work for Him without first being with Him?
